(VITUS VINIFERA)

such a sweet treat!



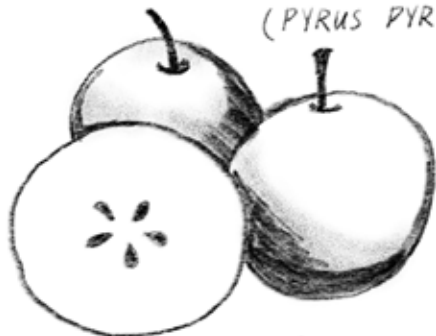

NAME: Pear  
(PYRUS PYRIFOLIA)



blossoms are symbol  
of early spring



Large and round  
→ similar texture to apples,  
with a slight pear taste

(looks like a pie!)

NAME: Cranberry  
(VACCINIUM MACROCARPON)



Ready for Harvest  
when fruit turns  
deep RED color

Juice is usually  
sweetened with  
other fruit juices  
to minimize tartness

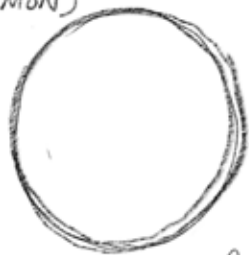
NAME:

Wild trees still grow in Southern China and on Hainan Island

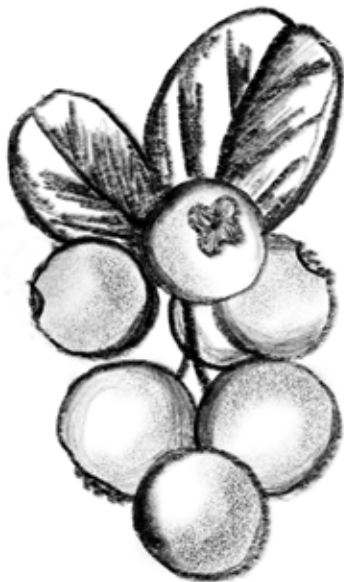

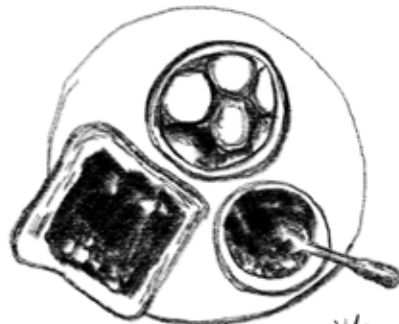
NAME:

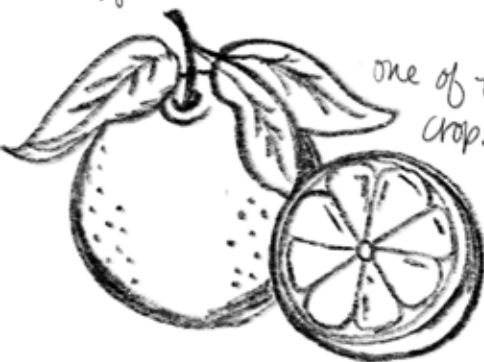
NAME: Orange
